## BROADWAY CORRIDOR PARCEL 4A

Holst will work with Home Forward, Urban League of Portland, and Colas Construction on the <u>first</u> <u>project in the Broadway Corridor</u>. This mixed-use development will provide an estimated 230 units of affordable housing with onsite amenities and services.



# CENTER FOR TRIBAL NATIONS

The <u>Center for Tribal Nations</u> will be a community gathering place for Indigenous peoples in the Pacific Northwest and support partnerships between Native and non-Native organizations. Holst is honored to be part of the Indigenous-led project team working on the Center that will be located along the Willamette River in Portland's Central Eastside.



## THE HEIGHTS DISTRICT SITE B

Working with a talented team, Holst is designing Site B of The Heights District in Vancouver, Washington. The mixed-income housing project will provide approximately 274 units and retail spaces on the ground floor.



## ENERGY TRUST OF OREGON NET ZERO FELLOWSHIP - POST OCCUPANCY EVALUATIONS

Holst is thrilled to have received a <u>research grant from the Energy</u> <u>Trust of Oregon</u> to conduct a Post Occupancy Evaluation on one of our projects. Senior Associate Maggie Harris will explore the relationship between building performance and resident perceptions.
